## Building the Future

Children's Trust, with local community partners and practitioners, is laying the foundations for parents across our state to get the help they need when and where they need it.

The Positive Parenting Program, or Triple P, is a series of parenting sessions and interventions designed to provide caregivers with the knowledge, skills and resources they need to raise healthy and thriving children.

Since 2018, Children's Trust and its partners have implemented Triple P in Georgetown, Greenville and Spartanburg Counties, serving families and setting the foundation for program delivery. Building on that success, we are now working to reach more communities by training and networking with Triple P practitioners to expand across the state. In 2023, we launched the Triple P South Carolina Network.

Dedicated to continuous quality improvement and grounded in understanding the best practices in parenting support, this network of professionals is driving positive change across the state. The Triple P South Carolina Network is poised to play a vital role in building a brighter future for future generations by promoting positive parenting practices and fostering resilience in families.

# Engaging South Carolina Families

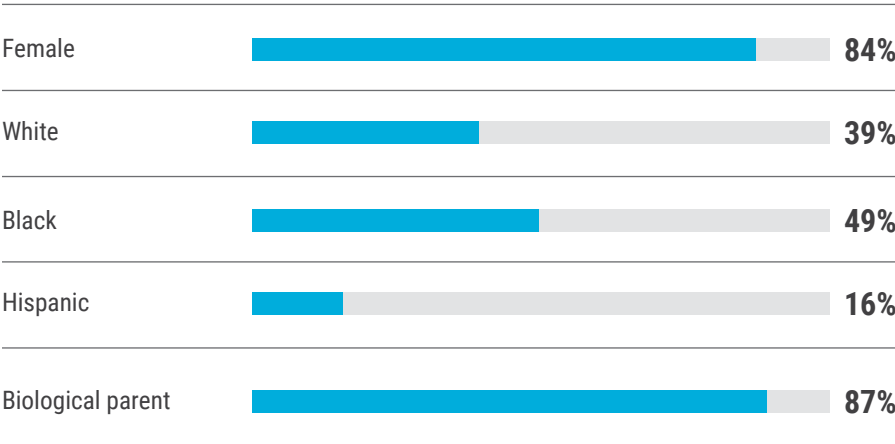

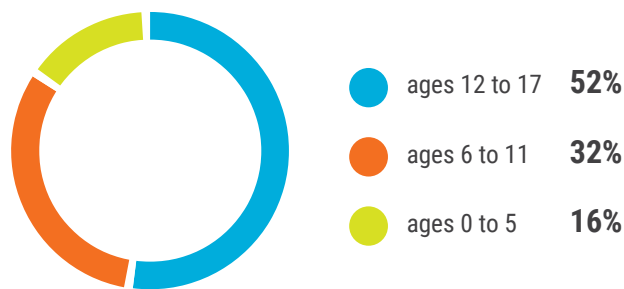




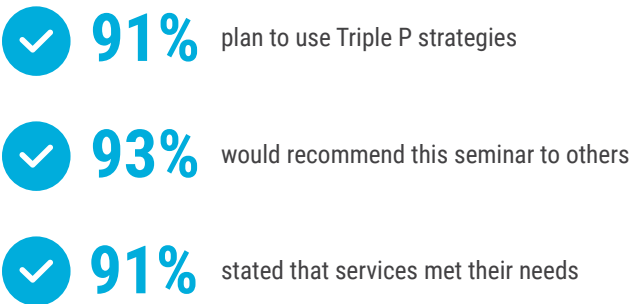
## Parent and caregiver demographics

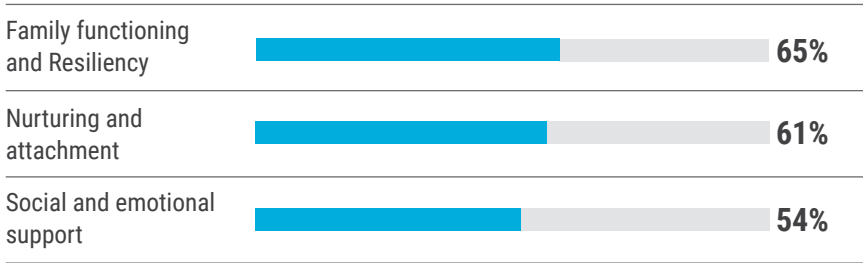
Connecting families to services builds protective factors



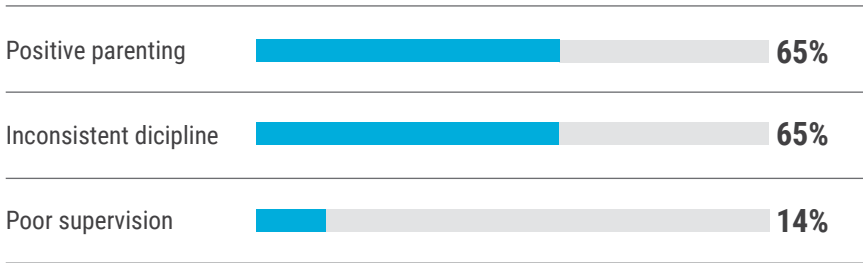

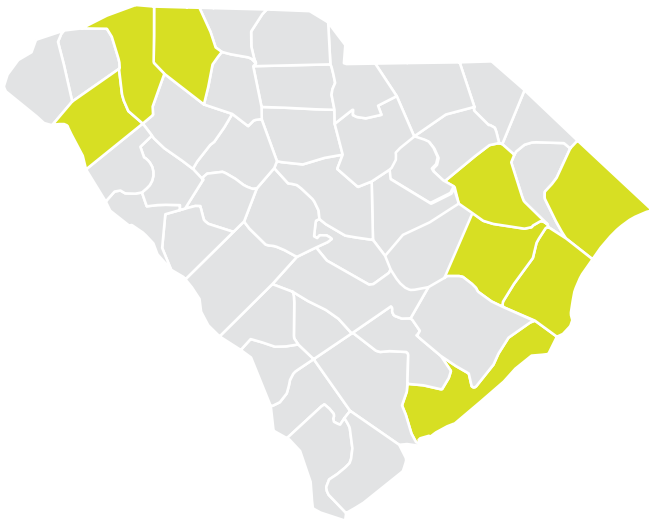

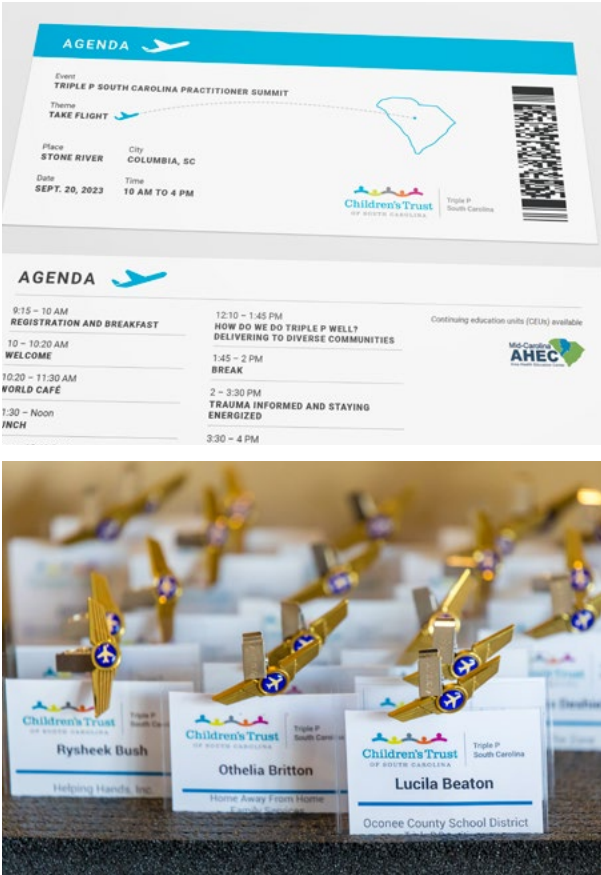
# Launching the Triple P South Carolina Network

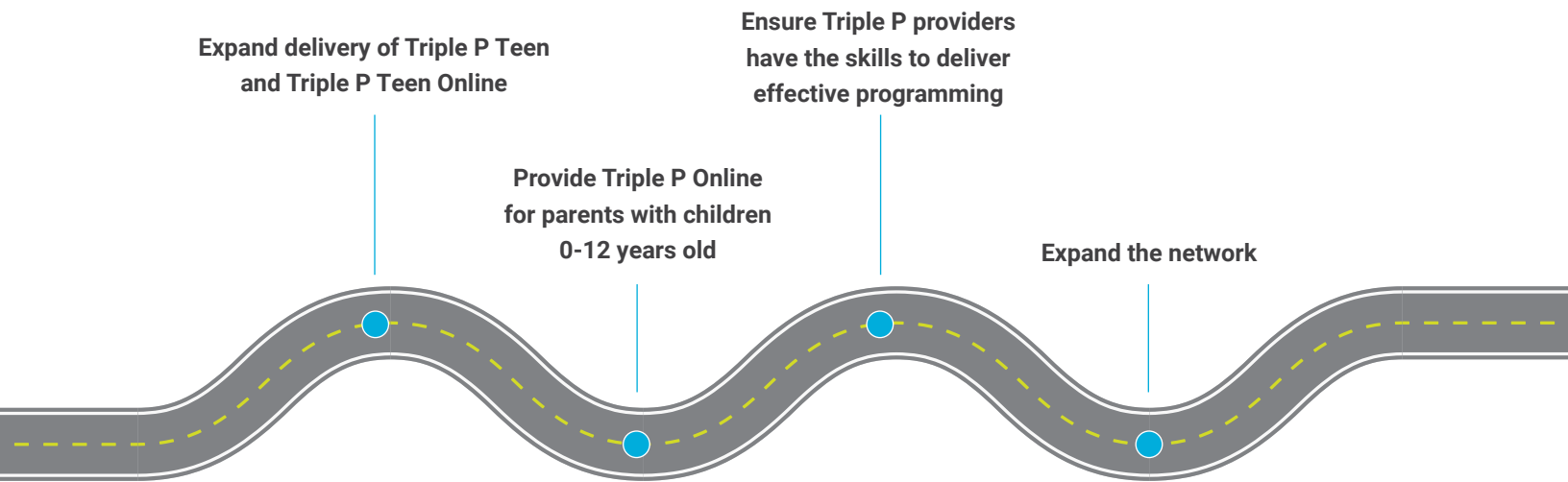
