Understanding what to expect is an important protective factor in reducing child maltreatment and promoting child well-being. Training participants will receive information on the following topics: building a healthy brain, social-emotional development, and understanding temperaments. Training Objectives

By the end of this training, participants will:

- Understand basic brain development
- Gain increased insight on effects of trauma on the developing brain
- Understand basics of child development and age-appropriate expectations
- Increase awareness of differences in child development and developmental delays
- Learn about emotional intelligence and how to increase it
- Increase awareness of temperaments and how they complement or clash



This training is ideal for case managers, social workers, early childcare providers, parents, foster parents and anyone else interested in understanding early childhood development for effective interaction with young children.
