Overview of Responding to Abuse and Neglect

Responding to abuse and neglect effectively requires a clear understanding of the types of maltreatments and why they may occur. Training participants will receive information on the following topics: overview of types and signs of maltreatment, parenting attachment styles and how parents are affected by their own trauma from childhood, and strategies to support parents who may be experiencing risk factors for abuse and neglect. Please join us over the course of two days for five hours of training credit.

Training Objectives

By the end of this training, participants will:

- Discuss definitions, signs, and effects of abuse and neglect.
- Identify risk and protective factors for abuse and neglect.
- Discuss ways to respond to troubling parent-child interactions and challenging behavior.
- Understand attachment and belonging.
